Mifflin-Juniata Energy Bank

United Way of Mifflin-Juniata partners with the Mifflin-Juniata Human Services Department to offer the Mifflin-Juniata Energy Bank. The Mifflin-Juniata Energy Bank provides heat assistance to veterans, residents age 60 or older and families who have been denied Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) benefits due to income ineligibility.

Every year the United Way of Mifflin-Juniata hosts the Walk for Warmth, the only fundraiser for the Mifflin-Juniata Energy Bank. The 10th annual Walk for Warmth was held on February 8, 2020 at Kish Park and raised \$5,000 for the Mifflin-Juniata Energy Bank. The Walk for Warmth proceeds enabled the Energy Bank to be responsive to meeting the needs of our most vulnerable residents. Donations from this year's Walk for Warmth allowed Energy Bank recipients to access funds to assist with rental or heating costs.

From November 12, 2019 through March 31, 2020, the Mifflin-Juniata Energy Bank provided heating or rental assistance to a total of 62 families in Mifflin and Juniata counties. The cost of assisting 62 families in the two county area reached \$17,106.45.

The Nurse's Pantry

The Nurse's Pantry is an initiative that focuses on elementary school students in both Juniata and Mifflin counties that have obstacles that prevent them from attending school. The lack of items such as clothing, shoes, and hygiene products including lice kits may prevent children from attending school or cause them to be sent home from school. United Way of Mifflin-Juniata aims to help students stay in school so that they can learn and grow. The Nurse's Pantry will provide resources to address many non-illness issues that keep students from attending school. The Nurse's Pantry is offered in two elementary schools in Juniata County as well as all elementary and intermediate schools in Mifflin County.

During the 2019-2020 school year, The Nurse's Pantry helped 148 elementary students in Mifflin County and assisted with purchasing items for 309 students in Juniata County.

Success By 6

Success By 6 is the early childhood initiative at the United Way of Mifflin-Juniata. SB6 has been working in Mifflin and Juniata counties since 2005 to build cross sector collaborations supporting children and their family's birth to age six to be prepared entering school and continue as successful lifelong learners.

Kindergarten Transition Activities

- -96 families attended the MC Kindergarten Readiness Workshops during Jan. & Feb. 2020. Every elementary school had an increase in attendance from last year.
- -SB6 hosted an in-service for 12 Early Childhood staff from Mifflin and Juniata Counties on Dec. 4, 2019. The in-service provided an introduction to the Heggerty Phonemic Awareness Curriculum which is used in both school districts. All staff that attended the in-service received a copy of the curriculum.
- -Juniata County Connecting to Kindergarten Nights and Data Nights were canceled due to COVID-19.

Community Outreach

- -August 28, 2019, Success By 6 hosted the Philadelphia Food Trust organization for a community listening session. The conversation identified current practices, goals and barriers around healthy food, physical activity and screen time in Early Childhood Education settings. This event was one of three listening sessions which took place across the state. This was a unique opportunity for Success By 6 and the early childhood education providers, parents and community leaders to share their thoughts and challenges around these topics.
- -SB6 in partnership with Summit Early Learning delivered approximately 200 New Mom Literacy Bags to new moms at Geisinger-Lewistown Hospital. Due to COVID-19 the project has been on hold since March.
- -SB6 partnered again this year with Lewistown Kiwanis to distribute Early Learning Activity guides to early childhood programs and families in Mifflin and Juniata Counties.



Grant funding received in 2019-2020

- -\$3605.00 from First Book/UWPA to purchase books for families. Books were distributed through Head Start, early Head Start, Nurse Family Partnership and Healthy Families America.
- -The United Way/SB6 was approved as an EITC/Pre-Kindergarten Scholarship Organization in March.
- -\$1660.00 from the Center for Community Action to support the New Mom Literacy Bag project.
- -\$21,139.55 from the Early Learning Resource Center to promote kindergarten transition activities in Mifflin and Juniata Counties.
