Mifflin-Juniata Energy Bank

United Way of Mifflin-Juniata partners with the Mifflin-Juniata Human Services Department to offer the Mifflin-Juniata Energy Bank. The Mifflin-Juniata Energy Bank provides heat assistance to veterans, residents age 60 or older and families who have been denied Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) benefits due to income ineligibility or rent assistance to those qualified.

Every year the United Way of Mifflin-Juniata hosts the Walk for Warmth, the only fundraiser for the Mifflin-Juniata Energy Bank. The 11th annual Walk for Warmth was held virtually this year and raised approximately \$5,000 for the Mifflin-Juniata Energy Bank.

From November 16, 2020 through March 31, 2021, the Mifflin-Juniata Energy Bank provided heating or rental assistance to a total of 31 families in Mifflin and Juniata counties. The cost of assisting 31 families in the two county area reached \$9,562.83.

The Nurse's Pantry

The Nurse's Pantry is an initiative focused on elementary school students in both Juniata and Mifflin counties that have obstacles preventing them from attending school. The lack of items such as clothing, shoes, and hygiene products including lice kits may prevent children from attending school or cause them to be sent home from school. The Nurse's Pantry provides resources to address many non-illness issues that keep students from attending school. The Nurse's Pantry is offered in two elementary schools in Juniata County as well as all elementary and intermediate schools in Mifflin County. During the 2020-2021 school year, The Nurse's Pantry helped 70 elementary students in Mifflin County and assisted with purchasing items for 6000 students in Juniata County.

Success By 6

Success By 6 is the early childhood initiative at the United Way of Mifflin-Juniata. SB6 has been working in Mifflin and Juniata counties since 2005 to build cross sector collaborations supporting children and their family's birth to age six to be prepared entering school and continue as successful lifelong learners.



Kindergarten Transition Activities

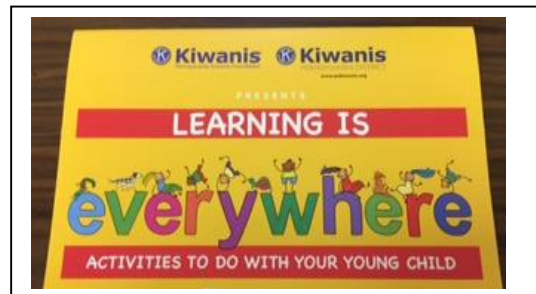
MC Kindergarten Readiness Workshops– Success By 6 and Mifflin County School District have partnered for the past 11 years to provide Kindergarten Readiness Workshops. The workshops are designed to educate and support families by implementing the research-based effective practices in the following areas; developing oral language and vocabulary, phonemic awareness, letter/sound automaticity, and basic numeracy skills. Due to COVID in place of the workshops we sent over 315 transition packets to families.

JC Transition activities were cancelled in the spring 2020 due to COVID-19

EITC Tuition Assistance–the United Way of Mifflin-Juniata/Success By 6 has been approved as a pre-kindergarten scholarship organization by the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED). This designation allows us to provide scholarship assistance for STAR 3 and 4 pre-kindergarten programs to children whose families are in financial need. The funding pays for a portion of the students annual tuition cost and is made available to families by local businesses who participate in the Employment Income Tax Credit (EITC) Pre-Kindergarten Program. As of January 1, 2022 the United Way has received \$26,500.00 and is assisting 4 families.

The New Mom Literacy Bag project – this is a collaboration between SB6, SUMMIT Early Learning and Geisinger Hospital. Due to COVID we could not visit the new moms at the hospital but we did drop off bags for the nurses to distribute. 200 bags were distributed. We also offered New Mom bags to families in Nurse Family Partnership.

Success By 6 continues to partner with the Kiwanis and the Kiwanis Foundation to provide Early Learning Activity Guides at no cost to early education programs, private preschools, early head start/head start programs, families and community agencies across Mifflin and Juniata Counties.
